## Course Description

This course explores the role of culture in the genesis, structuring, and resolution of processes of conflict within and between groups. We will pay special attention to ethnicity and other subcultural (or <a href="mailto:metacultural">metacultural</a>) markers of identity in complex social systems as both generators and outcomes of conflict. Analysis will proceed through consideration of case-studies drawn from a variety of cultural and social settings. We will also discuss some critiques of the culture concept with special reference to conflict analysis and resolution.
